Concerts on the Grass 2017

The well-attended show concluded the Bellingham portion of the 27th Annual Concerts on the Grass series organzied by ABMI. The month of July featured four scheduled concerts at the Bellingham Town Common: Kids Night on July 5 with children's singer Greg Cooney and stiltwalker Trevor the Games Man; the July 12 rain cancelled appearance by the Beatles tribute group Studio Two; the July 19 Quintessential Brass show which included free pony rides for the kids; and the July 26 appearance of Morse Code, led by Frank Morse.

The Concerts on the Grass series moves to Mendon in August for three shows at the Mendon Town Beach on Taft Avenue. The folk duo Yankee Notions appears Aug. 2 in a show sponsored by the Mendon Cultural Council; on Aug. 9 another duo named Knock on Wood appears with acoustic folkrock; and the concert series concludes Aug. 16 with Brass Connection.

At the meeting on July 13 of this year, the Directors unanimously elected Russell as Board President.

In other voting Diane Mela Souvanna and Tracy Aicardi both gained re-election to their Bellingham seats for three-year terms from 2017 to 2020.

Board Officer elections went as follows: Earl Pearlman was elected Vice-President. Souvanna was elected Secretary. Jereme Cooper was elected Treasurer. Russell was elected President.

All Board Officer terms are for one year.

Russell asked how the equipment at the Mendon Town Hall is holding up. Fleming said he has been replacing things item by item as necessary.

Fleming told the Board that some subscribers had trouble getting ABMI on their cable boxes. New boxes from Comcast will fix the problem.
