Grounds of ABMI Studio Receive Major Touch-up



Harris and Co. Landscape Design came down in October to perform a makeover of the front lawn, walkway, and shrubbery around the studio building at 10 William Way in Bellingham. All the grass was torn out and rolls of fresh sod laid down, along with a sprinkling system. Rhododendrons and other shaggy bushes next to the building were removed and replaced with new greenery. Board Discusses New Show *Easy Walks Wherever You Are*

The Nov. 10 'virtual' meeting of the ABMI Board of Directors featured a discussion about the newest ABMI show.

Easy Walks Wherever You Are, produced by longtime ABMI volunteer Marjorie Turner Hollman, debuted in October.

Board Member Earl Pearlman asked Production Coordinator Tyler McMinniman how the shooting has gone so far.

McMinniman said Hollman recently finished three episodes. Two feature a guest walking along with her and delivering information about the trail.

Station Manager Patrick Fleming noted that McMinniman captured some outstanding drone camera shots of the fall foliage around the Bellingham Town Common.



In other business, Fleming said he is adding the cost for the new gutters to the Capital Equipment Budget.

Fleming also said he is still waiting to hear back from the people installing the sign at Rt. 140.

Board Member Sue Carlson asked whether a permit had been secured for the sign. Fleming said the sign company will secure the permit. Board Member Jereme Cooper said the throw from snowplows should be taken into account when choosing location of the sign.

Board President Tracy Aicardi asked about the Covid-19 Update show. Fleming said Bellingham town officials came down to the studio to shoot the update. He said it may become a regular thing.

Fleming told the Board he has yet to receive a hard copy of the contract with Verizon. The first capital equipment check from Verizon has been received.

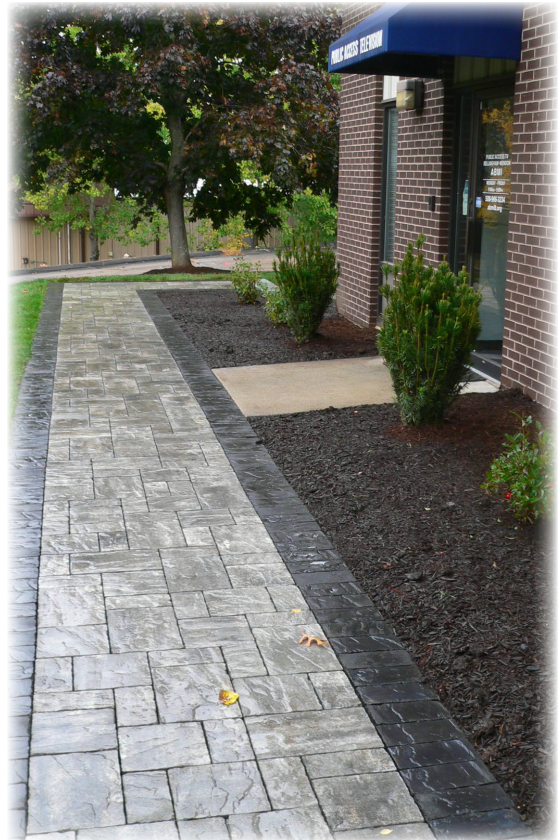
